# THE GURSTON DOWN 2023 HILLCLIMB CHAMPIONSHIP AND THE BARC (SW) GURSTON DOWN 2023 TOP TEN CHALLENGE

## SPORTING & TECHNICAL REGULATIONS

## Organised and administered by the BARC (SW Centre)

## Closing Date for Entries - 12 noon May 8th 2023

- 1 Title and Jurisdiction: The Gurston Down 2023 Hillclimb Championship and 2023 Top Ten Challenge are organised and administered by the BARC (South Western Centre) in accordance with the General Regulations of Motorsport UK (incorporating the provisions of the international sporting code of the FIA) and these Championship Regulations. Motorsport UK permit numbers CH2023/SO13 (Grade D) (Championship) and CH2023/SO12 (Grade D) (Top Ten Challenge) have been issued.
- 2 Competitor Eligibility: Drivers and Entrant/Drivers must be fully paid-up valid membership card-holding members of the BARC (SW) throughout the season, be Registered for the Championship and be in possession of valid Interclub Competition Licence, as a minimum.

A competitor shall not take time off school to participate in motor sport without the prior written approval of their school. If participation in the Championship requires absence from school, Drivers in full time school education are required to have the approval of their head teacher and a letter stating such approval from his/her school in order to fulfil registration for the Championship.

All necessary documentation must be presented for checking at all rounds when signing-on.

**Registration:** Those wishing to register for the Championship and/or Challenge must do so using the Gurston ALPHA entry and linked payment system. Due to adopting the ALPHA system, paper entry forms are no longer possible. The fee will be a single payment of £25 for entry to the Championship and the Top Ten Challenge combined. Registration will NOT guarantee an entry at any meeting, and normal entry procedures apply, refer to SR's.

The registration list will close at noon on May 8th 2023.

No points will be awarded retrospectively after a meeting (first timed run) has started.

Contenders will be required to carry Championship and Challenge (but not class) decals on their competition cars.

#### 4 Championship Dates:

April 1: rounds 1 and 2 April 2: rounds 3 and 4 April 29: rounds 5 and 6 rounds 7 and 8 April 30: June 17: rounds 9 and 10 June 18: rounds 11 and 12 July 22: rounds 13 and 14 July 23: rounds 15 and 16 rounds 17 and 18 August 26: August 27: rounds 19 and 20

(Please note: May 27 and 28 meetings are not rounds of either the Championship or the Challenge.)

**Venue:** Gurston Down Hillclimb is held at Gurston Down Farm, situated 1 mile west of Broad Chalke, which is 9 miles SW of Salisbury, Wiltshire, post code SP5 5HR. The entrance to the hill is at map reference OS sheet 184, SU 026 252.

5 Organising Club: The BARC (SW Centre).

6 Technical Regulations - **Eligible vehicles:** All vehicles must comply with the Technical and Safety Regulations defined in S.10.1.1 to S.15 as applicable.

Classes: For the purposes of Championship marking vehicles will be divided into the following Classes:

- i) Classes 4a, 4b and 4c Road Cars Series Production: vehicles complying with Motorsport UK 2023 Yearbook Section S.12, and for Gurston Championship Rounds the classes will exclude vehicles with non-ferrous chassis.
- ii) Class 4d Road Cars Specialist Production will comply with Motorsport UK 2023 Yearbook S.12.1.2, and for the purposes of the Gurston Championship will include both a seat and seatbelt/harness for the passenger side of the vehicle.
- All cars need to be defined as one of the following categories of car for safety and scrutineering: Road Car Series Production S.12; Modified Car S.13; Sports Libre S.14; or Racing Car S.15, including Class 13 "Historically Interesting" (pre-1973).
- iv) Please note there is no class for Standard Cars, section S.11. Cars compete in one of the Road Car classes 4a 4d or 4-MX5. Therefore we are not able to accept entries from Junior Sprint and Junior Hill Climb entrants (S.7.1.9), or an Intro-Class. S.11.1.3.
- v) As in BARC (SW) SR's referred to, Electrified Vehicles (EVs) are not permitted at Gurston Down. Refer to Motorsport UK Guidance Notes for Organisers (available at to Motorsport UK website Resource Centre). This refers to hybrid (HEV), plug-in hybrid (PHEV) or battery electric (BEV) vehicles.
- **Specific Championship Regulations:** By registering for the Championship all competitors and their associates commit to positively promote and demonstrate the Motorsport UK's Respect Code which is appended to these regulations (Appendix 3).

Where any reports of disrespectful conduct are judged to be well founded the Championship organisers may issue warnings or require remedial actions and/or report the matter to the Championship Stewards who may impose appropriate penalties which can include loss of Championship points and/or race bans through to Championship Expulsion and referral to Motorsport UK.

It is imperative that we promote the safety and wellbeing of young people and adults at risk. In addition to this all participants must be aware of their behaviour and conduct at all times and abusive language and harmful behaviour will not be tolerated. Any such incidents must be reported to the Championship Coordinator and/or Safeguarding Officer who will also relay the report Motorsport UK. Details of the Motorsport UK Policies and Guidelines are available at www.motorsportuk.org/resource-centre by selecting Policies and Guidelines.

Due to both safety and environmental concerns, vehicles **must not** be left unattended under any circumstance when the engine is running.

#### **8** THE CHAMPIONSHIP

(i) Points are scored in each round by comparing the drivers time against a class target time. The target times for each class <u>at the start of the 2023 season are listed in Appendix 1.</u>

The calculation, to the nearest 100<sup>th</sup> of a second is as follows:

## Points scored = (Target Time minus Drivers Time) plus 20.00.

For example if the Class 4a Target Time is 40.40s and the competitor drives 40.80s, putting these into the calculation becomes:

(40.40 - 40.80) + 20.00 = 19.60. the competitor scores 19.60 points.

If, for the same target time, the competitor drives the hill in 40.30s, beating the target time by 0.10, the calculation is:

(40.40 - 40.30) + 20.00 = 20.10. the competitor scores 20.10 points.

Double points will be awarded for the final two August rounds, on Sunday 27th August.

The initial class target time has been set as the best time set in each class by a registered Gurston Championship contender in the previous two seasons in which times in the class were set. Target times (including any adjustments) will be published before each round of the championship, and as far as practicable during a meeting, as soon as the results from the round earlier in the day become available. The current target times will be on display at the office.

Target times of any class where the target time is beaten in a round, will be updated to the new target time before the next round, so they reflect the state of competitiveness in each class as recently as possible.

Points gained in FOURTEEN of the TWENTY qualifying rounds will count towards the Championship scoring total. Each one day meeting will comprise TWO qualifying rounds of the Championship, meaning each of the two competition runs will count towards Championship scoring.

In order to qualify for points in any event, a competitor must be classified as a 'finisher'. In the case of force majeure, should only one complete run be attained, points will be scored on that one run.

- ii) Competitors may only score points in their nominated (at championship and challenge entry) class. It is permitted to change car within the class. Points from more than one class will not be added together to count towards the overall championship total.
- iii) **Resolving Ties:** In the event of a tie for season position between two or more competitors the following tie-break procedure will be adopted in the sequence shown below until a result is achieved.
  - a) The competitor with the higher number of scoring rounds wins.
  - b) If still equal, the competitor with the higher total of the dropped scores wins.
  - c) Should these methods fail to produce a clear winner, the Committee of the BARC (SW) will decide what further action should be taken
  - d) Championships points appeals, refer to C.6.5.
- iv) In the case of some events being cancelled for whatever reason, the number of qualifying rounds will be reduced proportionally. Refer to table appendix 2.
- v) At the conclusion of the Championship, trophies will be presented as follows:

1st overall The Wadham Stringer Trophy (to be returned by 1.10.24), £250 cash and a souvenir trophy.

2nd overall A souvenir trophy
3rd overall A souvenir trophy

1st in each Class
2nd in each Class
3rd in each Class
A souvenir trophy (providing there are 1 or more registered participants)
A souvenir trophy (providing there are 5 or more registered participants)
A souvenir trophy (providing there are 9 or more registered participants)

1st in Class 13 The Keir & Cawder Quaich and a souvenir trophy
1st in Class 19 The Tom Elton Trophy and a souvenir trophy

1st in Class 20 The A & S Racing Trophy and a souvenir trophy
1st in Class 21 The Chairman's Cup and a souvenir trophy

The Committee of the BARC (SW) may offer additional trophies.

## 9 THE TOP TEN CHALLENGE

- i) Championship Regulations 1 to 7 above apply.
- ii) The twelve registered competitors with the best times overall from the two competitive runs, irrespective of class, and irrespective of the class they registered into, will have a Run-Off. The 10 fastest from the run-off will be awarded points. There will be 10 points for the best time down to 1 point for the tenth best time. For tied scores to 1/100<sup>th</sup> second in the run-off, equal points are awarded, and rule 8 (iii) above applies to tied scores at the end of the season.
- iii) Points scored in up to SEVEN qualifying run-offs will count towards the Challenge scoring total. In case of some events being cancelled for whatever reason, the number of qualifying rounds will be reduced proportionally. Refer to table appended.
- iv) Double points will be awarded for the Sunday August 27th run-off.
- v) If the Clerk of the Course decides for whatever reason (e.g. force majeure, insufficient time, weather, etc) not to hold a top 12 run-off, no points will be awarded and that round is cancelled and the number of qualifying rounds will be adjusted proportionally as per Appendix 2.
- vi) In the event of a season tie between two or more competitors the tie-break procedure will be the same as 8(iii) above.
- vii) At the conclusion of the Challenge trophies will be presented as follows:
  - 1st The Guards Trophy (to be returned by 1.10.24), £250 cash and a souvenir trophy
  - 2nd A souvenir trophy 3rd A souvenir trophy
- 10 If a competitor wins both the Championship and the Challenge at the end of the season, he/she shall receive the Championship trophy only. Gaps left in the listing will be filled by the promotion of those competitors in lower positions.

Intermediate bulletins and final results will be issued periodically to all registered contenders competing in the relevant qualifying events.

- **12** Sporting Regulations judicial procedures:
- i) Rounds in accordance with Section C of the Motorsport UK Yearbook 2023 and the BARC (SW) SRs.
- ii) Championship in accordance with Section C of the Motorsport UK Yearbook 2023 and the BARC (SW) SRs.
- 13 All other relevant GRs of Motorsport UK apply as written (e.g. Sections D.7; W.2).
- 14 Only Registered Contenders in the Championship or Challenge are eligible to win driver / car related Annual trophies.
- **Data Protection Policy**. The BARC (SW) holds competitor records on computer which are used by the Club only for its own purposes. If any competitor objects to their records being held in this way, please inform the Championship Co-ordinator. Motorsport UK Data Protection Policy is published on Motorsport UK website.
- 16. Environmental concerns: Motorsport UK are exceedingly concerned of the impact of single-use plastic tyre wrapping and with reusable alternatives available competitors are encouraged to reduce plastic usage in this regard. The use of these plastic wraps is prohibited.
