

B.A.R.C SOUTH WESTERN CENTRE – GURSTON DOWN HILLCLIMB

Supplementary Regulations (SRs) for 2023 Gurston Down Hillclimb.

SRs apply to all meetings unless otherwise indicated.

- 1 **STATUS:** Meetings will be held under the General Regulations of Motorsport UK (incorporating the provisions of the International Sporting Code of the FIA) and these Supplementary Regulations (SRs) and any written instructions the organising Club BARC (SW) may issue for the events.

His Majesty's Government and Motorsport UK guidelines relating to Covid-19 at the date of each event will apply. BARC (SW) reserves the right to make alterations to these SRs as HMG and Motorsport UK Guidance on COVID-19 may be subject to change during the year, ref D.11.1.3. Note that numbers e.g. S.9.2 refer to sections in Motorsport UK Year Book 2023.

BARC SW Centre (Motorsport UK Club ID: 120314) will organise Hillclimb events at Gurston Down, Broad Chalke, Wiltshire, on the following dates in 2023, with Event Permits (Interclub licence grade unless noted otherwise) issued by Motorsport UK, as follows:

ENTRIES TO ALL MEETINGS OPEN ON ISSUE OF REGULATIONS AND CLOSE APPROXIMATELY 4-5 WEEKS BEFORE EACH MEETING OR EARLIER IF FULL, AS FOLLOWS:

Test Day, March 19: Opens on issue of regs; closes **1 March** or when full, whichever is sooner.

April 1-2: Opens on issue of regs; closes **12 March** or when full, whichever is sooner.

April 29-30, Opens on issue of regs; closes **2 April** or when full, whichever is sooner.

May 27-28: Opens on issue of regs; closes **30 April** or when full, whichever is sooner.

June 17-18: Opens on issue of regs; closes **28 May** or when full, whichever is sooner.

July 22-23: Opens on issue of regs; closes **18 June** or when full, whichever is sooner.

August 26-27: Opens on issue of regs; closes **July 23** or when full, whichever is sooner.

2 **PERSONS ELIGIBLE:**

- a) Interclub licence Events: All events are open to members of BARC (SW), plus contenders holding rounds of championships, plus invited clubs for certain events, holding a valid Motorsport UK Competition Licence appropriate to the event and car entered. See section 22 of the SR's for eligibility dates for entrants of visiting championships and clubs.
- b) National Licence Events: All persons holding a valid Motorsport UK Competition Licence of National or higher level appropriate to the event and car entered.
- c) Competition Licences appropriate to the meeting must be brought to the meeting, as there will be spot checks, together with (where appropriate) Club Membership cards valid at the time of the event (BARC membership MUST include SW Centre Membership). Members of invited Clubs failing to produce evidence of Club membership will be required to join the BARC and SW Centre.
- d) Please note there is no class for Standard Cars, section S.11. Cars compete in one of the Road Car classes 4a – 4d, MX5, see point 5 below. Therefore we are not able to accept entries from Junior Sprint and Junior Hill Climb entrants (S.7.1.9), or an Intro-Class, S.11.1.3.
- e) Electrified Vehicles (EVs) are not permitted at Gurston Down. Refer to Motorsport UK Guidance Notes for Organisers (available at to Motorsport UK website Resource Centre). This refers to hybrid (HEV), plug-in hybrid (PHEV) or battery electric (BEV) vehicles.
- f) By registering an entry all competitors and their associates commit to positively promote and demonstrate the Motorsport UK's Respect Code which is appended to these regulations (Appendix 1).

Where any reports of disrespectful conduct are judged to be well founded the Championship organisers may issue warnings or require remedial actions and/or report the matter to the Championship Stewards who may impose appropriate penalties which can include loss of Championship points and/or race bans through to Championship Expulsion and referral to Motorsport UK.

It is imperative that we promote the safety and wellbeing of young people and adults at risk. In addition to this all participants must be aware of their behaviour and conduct at all times and abusive language and harmful behaviour will not be tolerated. Any such incidents must be reported to the Championship Coordinator and/or Safeguarding Officer who will also relay the report Motorsport UK. Details of the Motorsport UK Policies and Guidelines are available at www.Motorsportuk.org/resource-centre by selecting Policies and Guidelines.

3 **PROGRAMME:**

- a) **SCRUTINEERING:** Starts at 7.30 am unless advised otherwise in final instructions. Competitors must make their cars available for scrutineering as per Final Instructions. Anyone who has not submitted the pre-event on-line information requested relating to scrutineering and/or whose car has not been satisfactorily scrutineered at the event will not be allowed to compete.
- b) **SIGNING ON:** This is managed by Gurston Hillclimb within the ALPHA on-line software. Accepted entrants will be informed by email how to complete signing on. As the software is provided by a third party, this may be subject to change during the season, in which case entrants will be notified, ref D.11.1.3. Every entrant must submit their on-line declaration before the deadline stated in final instructions. Anyone who has not signed-on will not be allowed to compete.
- c) **PRACTICE, COMPETITIVE RUNS and RUN-OFFS:** Practice starts at 08:30. Each competitor will be offered at least one, and under normal circumstances, two practice runs, ref S2.1. Practice will be in batches. Full details will appear in Final Instructions. Drivers are reminded that they should walk the hill before practice commences, S2.1.1. Drivers are not permitted to drive over the course prior to practice unless given permission by the Clerk of the Course.
- d) Starting order will be determined by the organisers. Cars will start singly, although the next car will normally be started prior to the preceding car crossing the Finish Line. Drivers will start in their own time when given the starting signal, which will be a green light. At all other times a red light will be shown at the Start Line. All competitors should be aware of the provisions of Motorsport UK Technical Regulations regarding Timing Struts, S.10.10.
Two timed competitive runs will be offered, normally starting after the lunch break. Circumstances permitting there may be additional timed runs. Additional runs will be non-competitive, in that they will not be counted towards any awards or records, except for visiting championships where this is expressly permitted..
- d) For events in April, June, July and August, there will be a 12 car run off for the Gurston Top Ten Challenge (refer to championship / challenge regs for details).
- e) For events in May there will be two Top 12 Run Offs per day, one for each round of the National Hillclimb Championship.
- f) Test Day, March 19, programme is different from above, to be confirmed in final instructions. Provisionally, start of practise and timed runs at 9.30 a.m. and continue until approximately 4 p.m. Full details of start time for scrutineering in final instructions to be issued to all competitors on acceptance of entry.

4 **COURSE:**

Gurston Down Farm is situated 1 mile west of Broad Chalke, which is 9 miles SW of Salisbury, Wiltshire post code SP5 5HR. The entrance to the hill is at map reference OS sheet 184, SU 026 252. The length of the course is 1057 yards (967 metres). It rises 175 feet (53 metres) overall, and consists of three left and three right hand corners. The surface is machine-laid tarmacadam.

NOTE: There is no class for Standard Cars. Cars compete in one of the Road Car classes 4a – 4d or 4-MX5.

- NOTE:** Class moves after entries close will not be permitted, except in exceptional circumstances. Written agreement from the Competition Secretary is required.
- NOTE:** Test Day will be run without classes. Cars will be in batches according to car number only.

NOTE: Class moves after entry will not be permitted.

ALL VEHICLES MUST COMPLY WITH CURRENT MOTORSPORT UK TECHNICAL REGULATIONS as per the Motorsport UK Yearbook 2023. No car may be driven by more than two drivers; no driver may drive more than one car. Cars must be entered in one Class only, which must be the correct capacity Class for its category. Any car which does not comply with the spirit of the Regulations or in the opinion of the organisers is presented in an untidy condition may be excluded or transferred to another Class at the discretion of the Organisers.

5.3 Class 4a, 4b and 4c – Road Cars – Series Production Cars: vehicles complying with Section S12, and for Gurston Championship Rounds the class will exclude vehicles with non-ferrous chassis. Class 4d – Road Cars Specialist Production Cars: vehicles as defined in Section S12.1.2.

5.4 Sports Cars will be defined as cars commercially available with only two doors, that is, with no four-door option or variant available.

5.5 Cars in Classes 4-MX5, 4a, b, c and d will only be permitted to use tyres from Motorsport UK Yearbook Section L List 1a and 1b.

5.6 All cars need to be defined as one of the following categories of car for safety and scrutineering: Road Car – Series Production S12; Modified Car S13; Sports Libre S14; or Racing Car S15, including invited classes and Class 13 “Historically Interesting” (pre 1973).

6 IDENTIFICATION:

Cars will be identified by means of a number, allocated by the organisers, as defined in S.9.2.5. When a car is driven by two drivers, only the number of the driver actually taking the run is to be displayed.

7 DRIVERS:

Refer to S.9.2. and K.14.3 Crash helmets must be worn at all times while the driver is in the vehicle when moving. Crash helmets must be as specified in the Motorsport UK Yearbook 2023 and must carry the appropriate Motorsport UK label.

Overalls: Section K.9.1 applies to ALL drivers.

Gloves: In addition to section S.9.2.1.2, ALL drivers are required to wear flame-resistant gloves, to specification, section K.14.3(e).

8 SILENCING:

Cars must comply with current silencing regulations as per the Motorsport UK Yearbook 2023. Noise testing may be carried out.

9 TYRE WARMING:

All Vehicles – No Tyre Warming or Spinning of wheels is allowed going to or before the Start Line. Artificial aids to raise the temperature of tyres will not be permitted. Environmental concerns: Motorsport UK are exceedingly concerned of the impact of single-use plastic tyre wrapping and with reusable alternatives available competitors are encouraged to reduce plastic usage in this regard. The use of these plastic wraps is prohibited.

10 AWARDS:

There will be an awards ceremony on the day unless stated otherwise on Finals or announced / posted at the office. If you cannot attend the awards ceremony, you are welcome to arrange for someone to collect an award on your behalf, or the award is forfeited. Awards will not be posted or distributed after the meeting.

NOTE: BTD Trophies will be held for 11 months and must be returned to the Organisers at the end of that time.

- b) First in class (provided there are 1 or more starters) – 1st Class award
Second in class (provided there are 5 or more starters) – 2nd Class award
Third in class (provided there are 9 or more starters) – 3rd Class award
- c) For the fastest BARC(SW) member, not being a British Hillclimb Championship or British Hillclimb Cup contender –
May 27 – The Alan Robbins Trophy; May 28 - The BathsPEED Trophy;
- d) BARC (SW) may offer additional awards / trophies.
- e) Awards for invited championships and clubs will not be offered for separate sub-divisions or grades or classes within the championship or club. However if advised by a championship co-ordinator, the awards can be distributed according to an index of performance. This will be calculated, on the day of the event, by the championship co-ordinator. Alternatively, the awards can be made available to the respective championship co-ordinator at the awards ceremony for subsequent distribution.

- 11 **ENTRY:** Entry to the event is ONLY using the ALPHA entry and payment system, with integrated on-line pre-event scrutineering and signing on. Due to adopting the ALPHA system, paper entry forms are no longer possible. Click on the 'web entry form' tab on our website, www.gurston-down.org or directly at <https://gurston-down.alphatiming.co.uk/users/sign-in>

Maximum entries: For the May meetings – 120 drivers per day maximum; for all other meetings (except Test Day) – 140 drivers per day maximum. Test Day – maximum 60 drivers. The organisers encourage submitting an entry as early as possible to avoid disappointment – entry to all meetings open from the publication of regulations, so may reach the maximum number of drivers before the stated closing date. A reserve list will be started once the maximum figure is reached. Subject to availability and payment in full, late entries (e.g. from the reserve list) may be accepted, at the organiser's discretion, allowing sufficient time for the smooth arrangement of the meeting.

However the organisers reserve the right to limit the number of entries in any particular class, invited championship and invited club. Receipt of your payment does not guarantee an entry. The organisers retain the right to accept or refuse any entries without stating any reason. D.14.1.1 refers.

Minimum Entries: The minimum for any meeting is 50 drivers. Should the minimum figure not be reached, the Organisers reserve the right to cancel the meeting. The minimum class size is one. Classes will not be amalgamated.

- 13 **ENTRY FEE:** The entry fee for all meetings will be £130 per driver per day.

Test Day entry fee £110 per driver, with no discount for double drivers as all drivers will have opportunity for the same number of runs.

b) **REFUND OF ENTRY FEES:**

- i) Before close of entries – Full refund
ii) After close of entries and up to 9 pm on the Tuesday preceding the event – Entry fee less £25 admin fee.
iii) Cancellation or postponement of the event – Entry fee less Centre's irrecoverable expenses.
iv) Any competitor whose entry is refused will be refunded in full.
v) No refunds if the meeting in progress is abandoned.

14 **OFFICIALS:**

- i) To be advised in Final Instructions, D.10.1.24.
ii) There will be Judges of Fact at the Start Line and the Finish Line. The names of the Judges of Fact will be posted at the start of the Meetings, G.10.2.

15 **RESULTS:**

Provisional results will be available as soon as possible after each Class and/or at the end of the meeting. Any protests should be made in accordance with Section C.5 et seq. The appropriate fee should accompany each protest.

16 FINISHING:

The Finish Line will be indicated by black and white chequer boards. Competitors must, on crossing the Finish Line, enter the Top Holding Paddock, at 10 mph or less being the speed limit, reference S.9.3.6 applies to all paddocks), parking as directed by the Paddock Marshal. Competitors' unofficial times may be available in the Top Paddock.

TOP PADDOCK STARTING: Batteries will be provided. Cars will not be push started. See S.10.3.3. External starters must be left in the Top Paddock for the day. Competitors whose cars are not self-starting, must declare on their entry form the method of operation together with a detailed starting instruction, see S7.1.6 (a). Cars will be returned down the hill in batches as instructed by the Clerk of the Course and Paddock Marshals. Drivers are reminded of S.9.3 for paddock movements..

17 SIGNALS:

The only signal which will be used on the hill will be a RED FLAG. ON BEING SHOWN A RED FLAG A COMPETITOR MUST STOP AND REMAIN STATIONARY AT THE LEFT HAND SIDE OF THE TRACK UNTIL INSTRUCTED OTHERWISE BY A MARSHAL OR OFFICIAL.

18 ALL OTHER MOTORSPORT UK GENERAL AND TECHNICAL REGULATIONS APPLY AS WRITTEN

except for the following, which is modified: H30.1.2 - Telephone / SMS and email notifications to the Competition Secretary are acceptable. If telephoning for example to withdraw an entry, please confirm by SMS or email as soon as possible.

19 PADDOCK: Bikes, skateboards and scooters are not allowed at the venue at any time, including before and after the meeting. Gazebos must be tied down / weighted at all times.

20 CAMPING / DOGS

Camping may be permitted per event, with the organisers and the landowner's consent, to be checked prior to each event. Details as to whether camping is permitted and under what conditions, and facilities will be available, will be announced in Final Instructions. When permitted, over-nighting at the following rate from which a donation is made to the village: Motorhomes and family tents £10 per unit, to be collected during the weekend.

No dogs are allowed in the paddocks or public areas during the meeting. You may be aware that Gurston Down is a large and prestigious shoot. Dogs obviously conflict with these interests. In order for dogs to continue to be allowed to come and camp with you it is imperative that they be kept on a lead at all times and be confined to the camping field. It is also respectfully requested that you have their worming regime up to date as our Landlord has to make a declaration to Farm Assurance to this effect. In August no dogs will be allowed at all.

22 REGULATIONS FOR MODIFIED LIMITED PRODUCTION MARQUE SPORTS CARS AND HISTORICALLY INTERESTING CARS:

- a) Definitions of these Classes are at the sole discretion of the Committee of the BARC (S/W Centre). Whether a vehicle is open or closed will have no effect on the category to which it is allocated.
- b) Classes 5 and 6 must comply with the Motorsport UK Hillclimb and Sprint Technical Regulations for Modified Series/Specialist Production Cars.
- c) Marque Sports Cars which are eligible will be as at Gurston Down in 1996 (list available from the Competition Secretary).
- d) There may be additions made to the lists at the discretion of the Committee of the BARC (SW). The Committee of the South Western Centre reserves the right to reclassify any vehicle that does not, in its opinion, conform to the spirit of the Regulations.
- e) Class 13 is for Historically Interesting Cars built up to and including 1972. Tyres are free. Wings are permitted where originally fitted.

23 REGULATIONS FOR FORMULA FORD CARS:

- a) Class 20a **MUST** compete as per pre-1994 circuit rules and **not** Hillclimb rules.
