An initiative designed to introduce women to the thrills and rewards of motorsport competition, **IntoSpeed** with the **BWRDC** aims to provide a clear, cumulative pathway into motorsport for women of all ages.

Based on the speed disciplines of Hillclimbing and sprints, participants race against the clock in a range of cars, including easily accessible and affordable road cars.

Building on the **success of the 2024 season**, we will once again be offering **women-only taster days at Harewood Driving Academy** (near Leeds) and **Gurston Down Hillclimb Drivers School** (near Salisbury) where qualified

instructors will guide you through the basics of car control and competition driving, sitting alongside you before you go out on solo runs. Safety equipment such as helmets may be provided, all you need to bring is your car and lots of enthusiasm!
